The Aggie Eagle Program is a recruiting program for the Corps of Cadets of Texas A&M University. Traditionally, the Corps has 300+ members who hold the BSA Eagle or the GSUSA Gold Award. The Program recognizes that the same traits that motivate a youngster to join scouts also encourage them, as collegians, to join the Corps. The Program focuses on juniors and seniors in high school who are Eagle Scouts or Gold Award Recipients. If any juniors or seniors are still actively involved in scouting, they will be considered to be on track for these honors and may attend the Program. Thus, Venture, Life and Sea Scouts are eligible if they are high school juniors or seniors and are still actively involved in scouting. Qualified attendees will be eligible for Corps scholarships.

### Requirements:

Seniors can meet attendance requirements by any one of the following:

1. Be in the Top 10% of their class,
2. Be considered an 'Academic Admit'
  - Top 1/4 of class and either a minimum 1300 SAT (at least 600 on both critical reading and math components), or 30 ACT (minimum 27 in ACT English and ACT Math)
3. Be in Top 1/4 of class and have either a minimum 1050 SAT (combination of math/critical reading sections only) or 23 ACT
4. Be in Top 1/2 of class and have either a minimum 1150 SAT (combination of math/critical reading sections only) or 25 ACT

Juniors may attend if they meet **all** of the following requirements:

- Be in the Top 1/2 of class, and
- Have an A- or better GPA, and
- Be on College Track

These are program minimums. These scores do not guarantee admission to TAMU. Space is limited.  
Those wishing to participate in the program should apply early.



### About the Corps of Cadets

- Membership in the Corps of Cadets is voluntary and does not require military service.
- With the exception of the military academies, the Aggie Corps is the largest uniformed ROTC program in the Nation
- Texas A&M is the only university West of the Mississippi where you can choose to be commissioned in the Army, Navy, Air Force or Marines.
- Approximately 42% of the Corps pursues a military commission. 58% of the Corps joins for the leadership training, the academic benefits and the camaraderie.
- The Corps has produced over 220 General Officers and one NASA astronaut.
- The Corps offers approximately 1,200 scholarships. Corps scholarships do not require military service. They may be used in conjunction with other scholarships. If awarded a Corps scholarship, an out-of-state recipient will qualify for in-state tuition—an approximate savings of \$30,000. Attendees of the Aggie Eagle Program will receive, at minimum, a \$2,400 scholarship.
- The Corps provides free tutoring through the General O.R. Simpson Corps Honor Society.
- Freshman & sophomore cadets are required to study 3 hours per night Sunday through Thursday during “Call to Quarters”.
