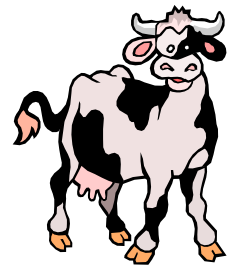

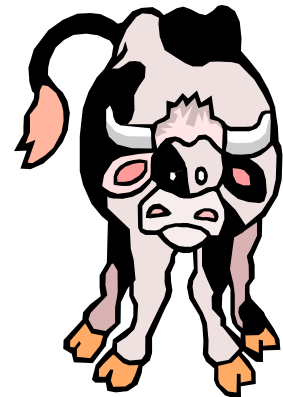
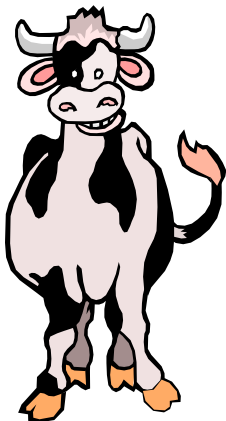

2007 Pow Wow Courses

1. Pack Administration: (1 hour) Learn how to your Pack operations run smoothly. This class will also cover BSA policies related to your Pack. Recommended for all Pack Leaders.
2. Den Meeting Dazzle: (1/2 hour) So you're a new Den Leader this year. Don't be overwhelmed by it all. We'll teach you how to plan and organize your Den program, one step at a time. Recommended for all Den Leaders.
3. Cub Crafts: (1 hour) Don't throw it out! Recycle the Cub Scout way by making neat stuff using things at hand. Craft ideas to fit your monthly themes and help with advancement. Recommended for all Den Leaders.
4. Space Derby and Raingutter Regatta: (1/2 hour) Most packs do Pinewood Derbies, learn about the two other derbies that your pack can do.
5. Everything Webelos: (1 hour) Get your Webelos program off the ground and keep it going strong. Recommended for Webelos Den Leaders and Cubmasters.
6. Wood Crafts: (1/2 hour) Learn woodcrafts that the boys will treasure for years to come. Recommended for all Pack Leaders.
7. Cooking like a Hobo (1 hour) Learn some great cooking techniques for Pack Outings along with some kid tested recipes and fun things they can make. Demonstration and hands on learning. Recommended for all Pack Leaders.
8. Awards: (1/2 hour) An overview of the many different awards that can be earned by the boys and the adult leaders. Recommended for all Cub Leaders.
9. Out N'About: (1/2 hour) Field trip, community outreach, and service project ideas. Recommended for all Pack Leaders.
10. Family Involvement: (1/2 hour) How to find, involve, and keep good people in your program. Recommended for all Pack Leaders.
11. Scout Technology: (1 hour) Learn to use your computer to streamline your pack functions. From making your own certificates, looking for resources online, making your own web page, or tracking awards. Recommended for all Pack Leaders.
12. Let the Games Begin: (1/2 hour) How to plan, teach, and lead age appropriate games.
13. Boy Management: (1/2 hour) Discipline, planning, and boy/adult relationships. Dealing with ADD/ADHD, and special needs scouts. Recommended for all Pack Leaders.
14. Basic First Aid: (1/2 hour) Cuts, scratches, and kids-how to treat them without either of you panicking.
15. How to use a Den Chief: (1/2 hour) Learn about how a den chief can help you present your program to your scouts.
16. Cub Scout Electives: (1/2 hour) Fun ways to lead magic, science, and other electives in the handbook. Recommended for Cub Scout Den Leaders.
17. Scouting Heritage: (1/2 hour) Where did the BSA come from, how has it survived for almost 100 years. Where is the BSA today.
18. Webelos Activity Badges: (1 hour) An overview of the 20 Webelos Activity Badges and ways to help the boys earn them. Recommended for all Webelos Leaders and Cubmasters.
19. Pinewood Derby: (1 hour) An interactive class on how to set up and run a Pinewood Derby race in your Pack. A hands on class where you will learn the ins and outs of a race and actually build and race a car. Recommended for all pack leaders.
20. Sports and Academics Program: (1 hour) An overview of the Sports and Academics Belt Loop and Pin program. Includes ways to include these into your den and pack activities. Recommended for all Pack Leaders.
21. Cub Scout Roundtables: (1 hour) What is a Roundtable, What do they do? Come experience an actual roundtable meeting and see the training and interaction that you are missing if you are not attending your districts roundtable. Recommended for all Pack Leaders.
22. Using Corporate Resources: (1/2 hour) Do you know and are you using corporate resources that are available to you in your local community. Do you know of resources that are already in place that you incorporate into your den or pack program. Recommended for all Pack Leaders.
23. Trails End Popcorn Fundraiser: (1/2 hour) Are you using the Trails End program to your fullest advantage. Learn how to make popcorn your main or only fundraiser of the year. Recommended for all Pack Leaders.
24. Water Bottle Rockets: (1 hour) Want to learn a fun and inexpensive craft and competition for your den or Pack. Build and fly a water bottle rocket. Recommended for all Den Leaders.
25. A Camping We Will Go: (1/2 hour) Learn about Camping and the Cub Scouts. What rules apply, how to increase family involvement.
26. Tigers All Around: (1 hour) Learn about how to manage and run a Tiger Cub program as a new Tiger Cub Den Leader.
27. Camping In/Ice Melt: (1 hour) Indoor tent camping experience for the entire family. Helps build den and pack unity.
28. Advanced Adult Training: (1/2 hour) Learn about BALOO, LOST, and Wood Badge training.
29. Safe Swim Defense: (1/2 hour) Learn about the BSA Safe Swim Defense program and how to run a safe water program in your den or pack.
30. Leave No Trace: (1/2 hour) Earn your Leave No Trace Card and learn about the BSA program so that you can teach it to the boys.
31. Youth Protection: (1 hour) Youth Protection training is required for all leaders.
32. Whitlin Chip/Tote-N-Chip: (1 hour) Knife Safety and usage program.
33. Safety Afloat: (1/2 hour) Learn about and become certified in the BSA Safety Afloat program.
34. Cub Scout Range Officer Certification: (1 hour) Learn about Cub Scout BB and Archery program.
